



What you need to know about the Nov. 3 Presidential Election

Virginians will be voting for:

- President and Vice President
- U.S. Senator from Virginia (one)
- U.S. House of Representatives (all districts)
- State constitutional amendments that would:
 - Create redistricting commission to draw congressional and state legislative maps
 - Exempt disabled veterans from paying motor vehicle property tax
- Local elections

**Early voting (mail-in and in-person) is open to all, no excuse needed.
Act early to make sure your vote is counted!**

Important deadlines to make sure your vote is counted:

- Register to vote or update your registration **NOW until Oct. 13**
- Request absentee mail-in ballot online or by mail **NOW until Oct. 23**
 - Requested absentee ballots will be mailed beginning **Sept. 18**
- Vote early in-person **between Sept. 18 and Oct. 31**
- Return completed ballot by mail or in person to [General Registrar](#) by **7 p.m. Nov. 3**
 - Mailed ballot must be received by registrar by **noon Nov. 6**
- Vote in person at your polling place **6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Nov. 3**

NEW! Drop boxes for completed mail-in ballots (sealed in envelopes) will be at registrar, satellite and polling locations. Check with your registrar for times and locations.
